Our creative curriculum provides termly overviews of prioritised subject areas. Our creative curriculum equips our children with the skills required to be independent and responsible citizens. It encompasses all the foundation subjects and aims to connect topics in a more robust cross-curricular way.

- Question and challenge
- Make connections and see relationships
- Envisage different and possible outcomes
- Take risks in a controlled setting
- Reflect critically on ideas
